“Lace!” Where did it come from and what’s it all about?

There are two types of lacework, bobbin and needle, which were first started in the sixteenth century Europe. In the beginning, lace thread was usually made from linen, then metallic gold threads or silk, followed by cotton in the nineteenth century. The types of lace were also usually named after the geographical area where they were made. Some of the premier lace making areas were in France and Italy. It is uncertain when lace was introduced in England, some claim Queen Catherine of Aragon taught lacemaking to people in Ampthill when she was there in 1531 awaiting her divorce from King Henry VIII; a pattern is still used there today which is named after her!

Intricate lacework involved three artists, first the artist who created the design on paper, then the pattern artist who translated the design and thus made the pattern for the third artist, the lace maker who worked with the patterns to create the lace. Lace has always been an expensive “luxury” purchase as its creation takes a lot of time and attention to detail. Fashion changes and trends have driven the changes in lace design throughout the centuries. Both men and women wore lace on their clothes as it adorned their collars, cuffs, over their shoulders, their hands, heads, their entire gown and their furniture as well. It was usually the most expensive part of their outfit. Due to its high value, rules were even put into place to restrict the import of lace and people began smuggling of lace into restricted countries!

From edgings to lappets, parasols, gloves, collars, and dresses, lace may be found everywhere you look. Inconspicuous to bold, finely worked to larger more handleable pieces, I encourage you to admire the sheer amount of work it takes to create these works of art by hand. There are many books and websites that cover the history of lace in more detail in case you are interested to learn more about this fascinating art form!

Description: Learn how to machine piece an interesting, colorful quilt border with absolutely no fabric waste. Perfect for beginner and seasoned quilters, this technique class is great for using up your scraps. This concept could also be incorporated in the body of a quilt and used over and over for future projects.

Description: *First*, I have five flower designs that are exclusive to my Play Date participants (shown in the photos you have). Each person will receive all five flowers, but choose one for class.

Second, I bring over 50 colors of wool felt and over 30 colors of Valdani threads for students to choose from.

Third, I bring beads, buttons, ric rac, and yarn that will be used to embellish. We spend the morning purely designing the flowers.

I'm your guide down the rabbit hole. The afternoon we design the bee and embellish our flowers in a good old fashioned "stitch and chat" with friends. Students only need to bring two pair of scissors to class. A regular medium size pair and and small, sharp embroidery pair like stork scissors. I've attached a photo of the bunny scissors I sell and use.
